As you may be aware it is Māori language week this week. Te wiki o te reo Māori provides an opportunity to celebrate and learn te reo Māori, helping to secure its future as a living, dynamic, and rich language. Kia Kaha te reo Māori is the theme, so when we say 'Kia Kaha te Reo Māori' we're saying - 'Let's make the Māori language strong'. I know that all the classes have had a focus on speaking te reo particularly this week. We received a number of ngā pukapuka ātaahua (beautiful books) from the Ministry. Te Waipuna have been learning these in the morning and then teaching them to the older children. This nurtures a learning environment that recognises the value of ako - the Māori concept means both to teach and to learn and it acknowledges the way that new knowledge and understandings can grow out of shared learning experiences.

Next Wednesday we are having Grandparents Day, a celebration to acknowledge the children's learning this term. This will start at 10.20 in Te Whare Akorangi (The House of Learning). Then grandparents are welcome to move into our classrooms with their mokopuna to see and hear about their learning. Next there will be a paramanawa (morning tea) from 11.00-11.20, followed by sharing of the children's Arts Programme back in Te Whare Akorangi.


We feel this will help the staff to be fully informed should a situation arise at Leigh School if a student contracts this illness.

"On the Lookout for Tuatara"


Featuring local landmarks. Local author
